## Croatia grants Lleida.net a new patent for its method of registered receipt of electronic email

Under the provisions of Article 17 of the Regulation (EU) No 596/2014 regarding market abuse and article 228 of the modified text of the Spanish Stock Market Act, approved by Spanish Royal Legislative Decree 4/2015, of 23 October and related provisions, as well as Circular 3/2020 of BME MFT Equity on information to be provided by Growing Companies, we are hereby informing you of the following information relating to LLEIDANETWORKS SERVEIS TELEMATICS, S.A.: (hereinafter "Lleida.net", or the "Company" or the "Enterprise") brings to your attention the following information that has been prepared under the exclusive responsibility of the issuer and its administrators:

The Croatian authorities have granted the Spanish listed Lleida.net (BME: LLN) (EPA: ALLLN) (OTCQX: LLEIF) a new patent number HRP20200490, for its Method for registering and attesting the receipt of email called "METHOD FOR THE REGISTRATION AND CERTIFICATION OF RECEIPT OF ELECTRONIC MAIL".

This patent, granted in Zagreb by the State Intellectual Property Office of Croatia (SIPO, for its acronym in English), is valid for 20 years.

The Lleida.net method allows automated registration and certification of receipt of email, issuing the documentary evidence that be served as evidence in court to attest receipt, content, delivery and the non-tampering of the information and the message.

This patent brings Lleida.net's worldwide patent portfolio on notification and electronic contracting to 201, showing Lleida.net's effort in its core and in the three pillars of its strategy: Innovation, Intellectual property, and Internationalization.
