NIPOST will distribute registered digital communications like the Registered mail and Registered SMS developed by Lleida.net as valid proof before courts of law and public administrations.

Nigeria is the largest country in Africa, and has 200 million people and over 190 million mobile lines. By signing this agreement, Lleida.net is taking a further key step for the market entry of Lleida.net, where it already has a patent.
